
BOX TOPS CONTEST!!




Greenwood Elementary SAGE Results

Utah's Student Assessment of Growth and Excellence (SAGE) is an assessment designed to measure academic success and growth. SAGE tests are based on the Utah Core Standards in English language arts, mathematics, and science. These standards establish a framework for high quality instruction and help teachers ensure academic achievement for students.

2015 SAGE results at Greenwood demonstrated increased proficiency scores in Math and Language Arts. School-wide scores are as follows:

- 43% proficiency in Language Arts (an increase of 3% from last year)
- 53% proficiency in Mathematics (an increase of 11% from last year)
- 49% proficiency in Science (a decrease of 4% from last year)

PACE Results


The Governor of Utah created an integrated 10-year plan for education and economic development in 2010. The plan is designed to lead us to achieving our state goal that 66% of all working-age Utahns will hold a post-secondary degree or certificate by 2020.

The "PACE" acronym represents the following recommendations to achieve that goal:

- Prepare young learners
- Access for all students
- Complete certificates and degrees
- Economic alignment

SWAMP Time

One of the essential questions that guides our practice is: "How will we respond to students who haven't learned?" If we want to ensure high levels of learning for *all* students, then we must be prepared with additional time and support for children that demonstrate the need.

At Greenwood Elementary this year we have created an intervention period in the day we call SWAMP Time. "SWAMP" stands for Students Will All Make Progress. Each grade level has a 30 minute intervention time available Tuesday through Friday. Teachers work with four paraprofessionals to provide systematic support to students throughout the grade level. Data gathered from common formative assessments is used to determine the interventions (or learning extensions) needed for each

We're excited to see how this SWAMP Time impacts student learning at our school as we strive to meet the needs of *all* of our learners.

Extra-Curricular

A variety of extra-curricular opportunities have been made available at our school this year. Students have had the chance to participate in the American Fork Children's Choir, a Robotics Club, a Coding Class, or a Girl Scout Troop. We hope to continue to offer opportunities like these as we believe that extra-curricular activities have positive connections to student learning.
