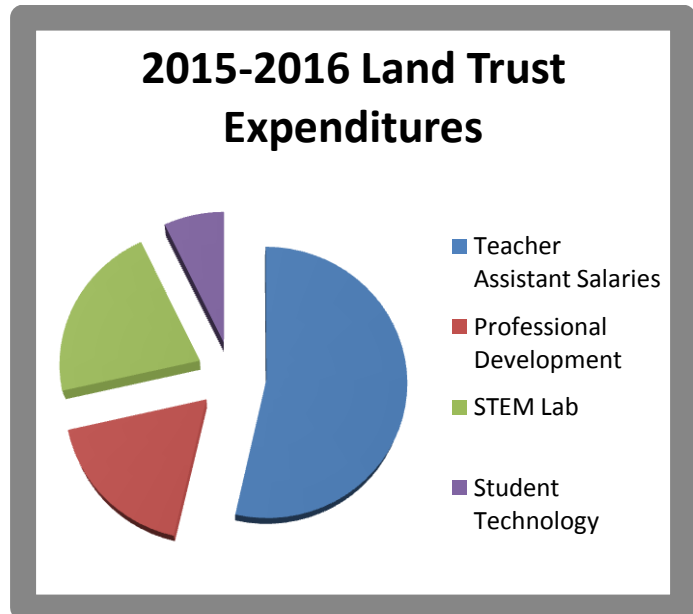

School Community Council

The Utah Legislature requires all schools to establish a School Community Council (SCC) to provide input, receive feedback, and have a stewardship over a number of important school duties. Specifically, the SCC responsibilities include: creating a school improvement plan, managing school Land Trust monies (approximately \$42,000 dollars for our school), assisting with professional development, analyzing school data and assessing student academic needs.

Last year the SCC allocated Land Trust monies in the following ways:

Teacher Assistant Salaries	\$22,500
Professional Development	\$7,500
STEM Lab	\$9,000
Student Technology	\$3,000

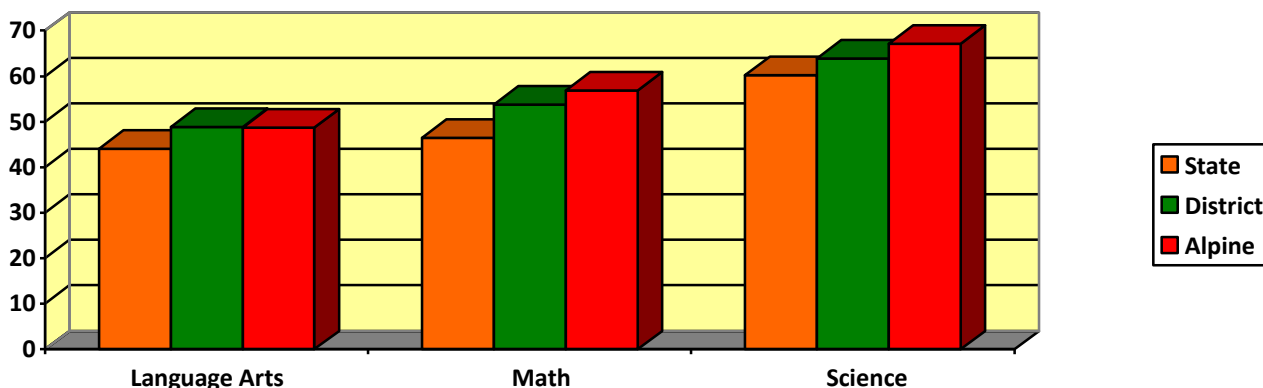

Alpine Elementary originally received an A, but because there is a new state law stating that if more than 65% of schools receive an A or B, cut scores were raised. 412 points/69% now needed for A grade.
