


STAKEHOLDERS REPORT

85% of the students in grades K-3 will reach the reading benchmark by the end of the year or demonstrate a year's growth in the 2018-2019 school year.


Students in grades 4-6 will reach 80% proficiency on grade level math assessments or make a 25% growth during the 2018-2019 school year.
