Important Items

Thanksgiving Dinners from Tabitha's Way: If there are any families (either staff or families of students) that may be in need this Thanksgiving season, please reach out to Principal Heaps (<u>dheaps@alpinedistrict.org</u>). Tabitha's Way provides full Thanksgiving meal vouchers each year to families in need. The voucher is good for a bundle of the following meal items: 10-15 Pound Turkey, Stuffing, Cake mix with frosting, Turkey roasting tin, Gravy, Potatoes, Dinner rolls, Cranberry sauce, Corn and green beans, Yams, recipe ideas, Canned Pumpkin, Rice, and Beans. If you notify us and receive a voucher, you will need to take the voucher and pick up the meal supplies on November 22nd. Pickup details will be provided on the voucher. Reminder of Sick Policy: We ask that if your son/daughter is sick with any type of sickness or COVID symptoms that they stay home until they are symptom-free for 48 hours. We will strictly follow this sick policy due to the significant number of high-risk students that attend our school. If a student comes with any illness symptoms, parents will be required to come pick them up from school. If your son/daughter tests positive for Covid-19, please call the school to notify the principal or nurse so we can determine potential spread. This is how we can keep our staff and students safe and well.
